

## **MEETING PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES AT AJUA – 05/06/2018**

The visit to Ajua by the Agape Unity team of two coordinators and two Rev. Sisters and the Driver had as its main objective to assist the persons with disabilities with basic needs in difficult times. Ajua and its neighboring quarters of Njimiya and Mundum constitute one of the border villages of Bafut Sub Division. It is this distance over hills and valleys that Sr. Judith and her team covered to share the love of the Agape Unity program with disabled persons and their families.

Having estimated and prepared packages of rice, savon, salt, matches and juice for 30 persons with disabilities, we were shocked to meet with a crowd of over 60 persons with disabilities coming from the three quarters that make up this village. Some who could not walk to the meeting hall were represented by abled relatives. Sr. Judith and the coordinators took turns to Educate to people on the causes of disabilities, the care for persons with disabilities, the need to follow up treatment for those who are taking drugs and finally to need to educate children with disabilities and show them love as they can also learn and engage themselves in various vocations to live with dignity and self-esteem.

It was then the most expected time for the persons with disabilities when they will receive their take home packages. Despite the unexpected population, the packages that were mean for 30 persons were redistributed to the group of over 60 persons with disabilities.
