Ushirika wa Neema; a community of sisters in the ELCT - Northern Diocese has 78 sisters serving in different capacities. God has been with us through out in our serving Him. We receive an average of 2-5 new girls annually. The new sisters are trained in different capacities to equip them with knowledge that enables them serve in the changing world.

LEADERSHIP

In 2015 we elected new leadership. Our senior mother, Sr. Agness Lema retired officially and she was succeeded by Sr. Elistaha Mlay. Rector Aaron Urio also retired his duties and Rev. Javason Mrema took over his duties. The installation of the new leaders took place on 5th December, 2015 and begun their new duties in January 2016.

OUR SERVICE

We serve in the church mostly working with children in kindergartens, orphanage centre, primary and secondary schools. Some of our sisters work with disabled children, children living in difficult environment and youth counseling. Some of us also deal with small projects in the convent for sustainability of the community.

The orphanage has 39 children for 1 day - 3 years.

Challenges

Our community has gone through various challenges including the closing of our Montessori primary school because of the changes in our education system. To recover it we need to reconstruct the buildings, a project that will cost us 578 million Tanzanian Shillings. This is the only Montessori primary school in our area and the children from our Montessori kindergarten move into this primary school as it's a special training that touches all sensorial organs of a child.

The boys' dormitory of our Sisters of Ushirika wa Neema Secondary School (SUN) in the south of Tanzania burnt down on 11th /02/2016. It was a difficult moment for the children as well as the sisters and teachers who serve in this school. But we thank God because there were no injuries in this accident. The dormitory is under construction now.

Let's keep praying for one another for peace and strength for all of us do our Diakonia service to God's people.

Report of Ushirika wa Diakonia Faraja to DRAE

December 2016

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

I greet you on behalf of the Deacons and Brothers of Ushirika wa Diakonia Faraja (UDF) in the Northern Part of Tanzania located near Sanya Juu in the district of Siha between Mount Kilimanjaro and Mount Meru. UDF is property of the Northern Diocese of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Tanzania.

Brotherhood

There are 32 Deacons belonging to Ushirika wa Diakonia Faraja. They are ordained by the Bishop.

The Brothers share their live in a community of duty, in a community of life and in a community of sending. They are allowed to merry after ordination. To Ushirika wa Diakonia Faraja belong the ordained Deacons with their wives and the widows of Deacons. We take care for them and their children.

The Deacons serve with their ministry in different professions in church and churchly institutions.



<u>Leadership</u>

Under the global Leadership of ELCT ND and Faraja Board the structure of Leadership in Ushirika wa Diakonia Faraja has two parts:

- 1. Senior Brother (kaka mkuu), Head of Deacon Training and Treasurer are the executive leadership being responsible for Faraja Diaconic Centre, Budget, Deacon Training and Administration.
- 2. The members of baraza are six elected Deacons completed by the executive leadership of UDF. They are responsible for brotherhood and community. Personal and other decisions made in baraza the Senior Brother is working on.

Deacon Students

Ushirika wa Diakonia Faraja offers the Deacon Training to all Diocese of ELCT and to the Evangelical Lutheran Churches in the Neighbor Countries where swahili and/or English is spoken. For the Brothers of UDF the Training takes 6 years: the first three years have to be finalized with the exams and the another three years are for field work and finish the time of probation to grow into the Brotherhood.

Students from other Diocese go back to their Diocese after the exams.

With December 2016 there have been 20 Students in Deacon Training. Three went home to the South-Central Diocese to join the Deacon Community there. If God wishes ten Applicants will join the Interview Days End of January 2017 to join the Deacon Training.

New Diaconic Centre located nearby Miono, Morogoro Diocese

It was a great blessing for Ushirika wa Diakonia Faraja when Bishop Dr. Fredrick O. Shoo launched the new Diaconic Centre nearby Miono assisted by Bishop Jacob Mameo Ole Paulo, Morogoro Diocese on 8.10.2016.

- Electric technicians

Three Deaconesses completed their studies and awarded degree in Education and Diploma in Business administration.

- Lack of modern working tools and transport facilities.
