Motherhouses in Switzerland

As the number of Deaconesses is decreasing, all of the Motherhouses face changes in their way of living together. The Sisters have to move closer together so that parts of houses or whole buildings can be used for other purposes - chances and challenges! Often this gives a new dynamic of getting to know each other and our personal needs in a better way and to share life in a deeper sense.

Some buildings still belong to the Sisterhoods; the alteration for new purposes is within their responsibility - again chances and challenges! Other buildings are going back to the foundations and they are using them for their purposes.

In several places the idea of "multi generation houses" is planned or implemented. Most of them will offer the opportunity of regular prayer and fellowship times.

Some Sisterhoods have expanded their communities with a Circle of Friends or an Order in a more open setting; the growing varies.
